HOW TO USE THIS DIRECTORY

This directory lists resources for homeless adolescents and young adults in the City of Chicago. It includes a listing of organizations by services provided, a geographic listing, a food pantry and free meal calendar, and a detailed alphabetical listing. You may use the listings by service or geographic area and the food pantry calendar to identify organizations that may meet your needs. Detailed information about the organizations, including address, phone number, website, age guidelines, parent/guardian consent policies, and fees can be found in the last section of this directory.

If age restrictions or parent/guardian consent requirements exist, they are described. If no age range or consent policy is noted in the organization's entry, you may assume that all ages are served and that parent/guardian consent is not required for youth to obtain services.

Some of the listed resources are specifically targeted to youth, while others serve homeless or low-income individuals of all ages. Organizations or facilities that specialize in youth services or serve youth exclusively are marked with an asterisk (*).

Every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of this directory. However, information may change over time, and so you may wish to contact organizations directly to confirm their location, fees, and policies before referring youth for services.
